#### 9. GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

9.1 Adoption of Resolution #15 1011, To Support Placing a Revenue Extension Measure on the Ballot; and/or Other Political Action

<u>BACKGROUND INFORMATION</u>: The ongoing fiscal crisis faced by the State of California is a major concern for school districts and as a result, districts are continuing to look for and find ways to manage and maintain fiscal solvency.

<u>CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS</u>: Staff continues to look at all options available to address the ongoing budget deficit incurred as a result of diminishing State funding allocations to school districts. Governor Brown has proposed a balanced approach to solving the deficit including revenues and new cuts. His proposal provides for an extension of temporary revenues to support programs for our students.

CSBA has developed a sample Board resolution which is included in the packet to support placing a revenue extension measure on the ballot. The serious nature of this situation warrants further discussion by the Board and/or other political action.

<u>FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS</u>: Financial considerations for the school district if the measure is placed on the ballot and is successful is approximately \$1,750,000.

<u>SUPERINTENDENT'S RECOMMENDATION</u>: It is the superintendent's recommendation that the board discuss possible political action surrounding this issue and consider approval of this resolution for adoption.
